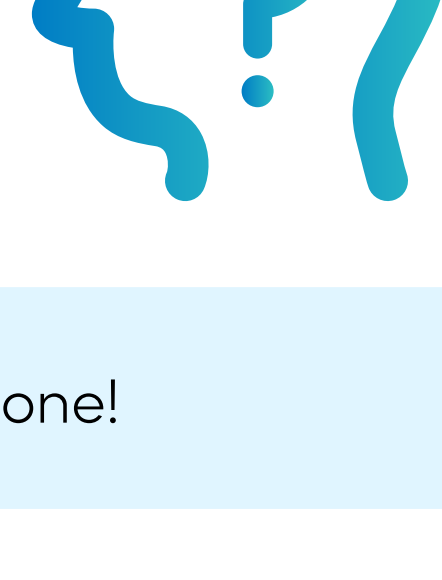


16 stats that show your productivity is being blocked

Take a look at these facts and stats that show just how many people and teams are feeling the productivity pinch.

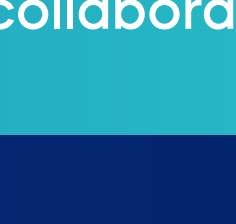

Wasted time



85%
of employees unproductively spend up to two hours searching for work-related information.



Every time your attention is taken away from your work, it takes around **23 minutes** to get that focus back



26%
of firms miss deadlines because consolidating client feedback takes too long

Communication and collaboration

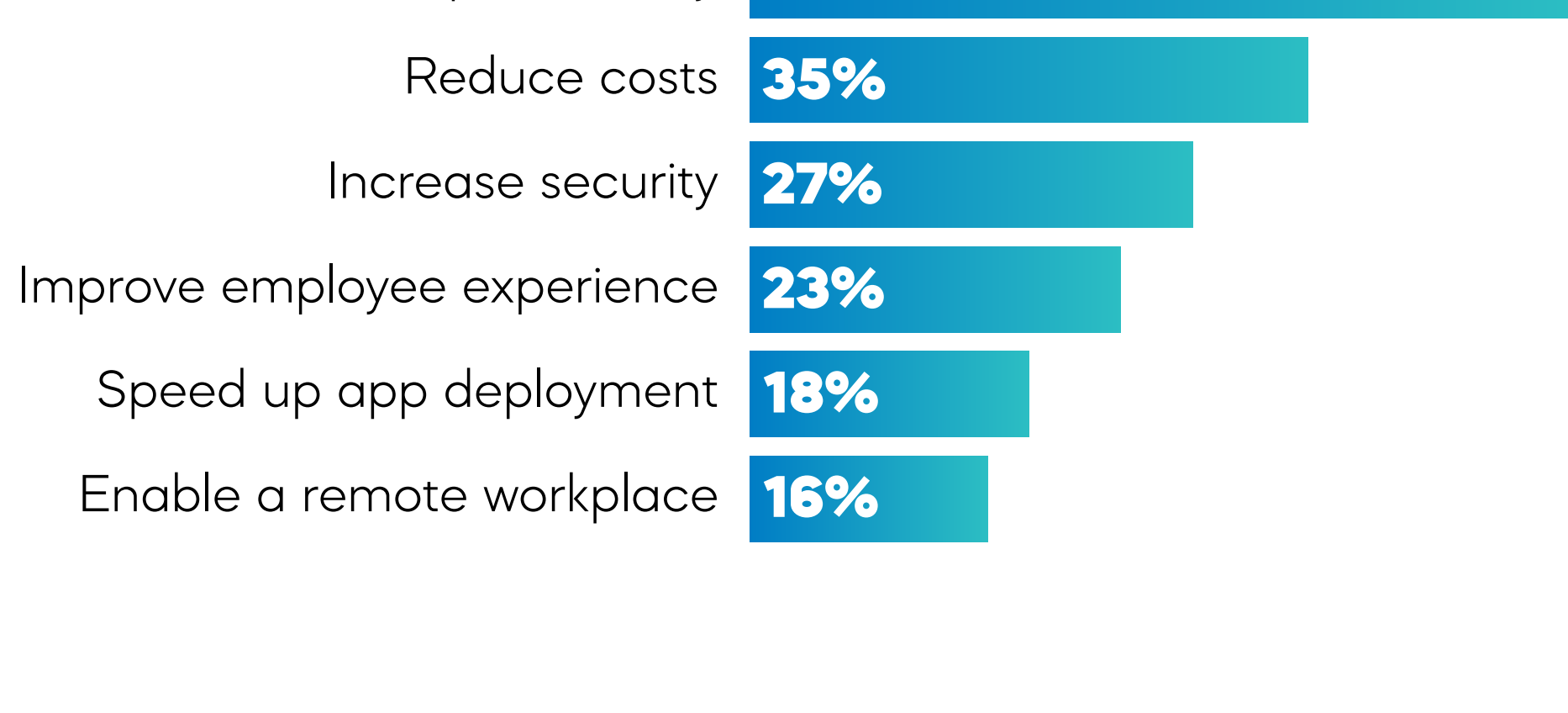
